

## **ODFORM Overview**

ODFORM allows for law enforcement agencies who use Case Explorer to collect more detailed information regarding a suspected overdose incident. ODFORM can only be accessed if you have a Case Explorer account and ODFORM cannot be used until a suspected overdose is submitted to ODMAP. Once data is entered into ODFORM, it is not stored in ODMAP however the incident can be seen on the National Map.

Due to HIPAA, no Personally Identifiable Information (PII) or Protected Health Information (PHI) information is stored in ODMAP. ODFORM can be linked to ODMAP but the data is stored on our Case Explorer Server.


## **Submitting Overdose Events through ODFORM**

Similar to ODMAP, ODFORM allows the user to manually enter case information using an online form. ODFORM still requires participants to enter the four required fields: 1) location, 2) time and date, 3) outcome, and 4) naloxone administration.

ODFORM also allows participating agencies to collect and track information such as: demographics, seizure information, and officer contact information. An example of ODFORM's data entry form can be found at right.



Case Explorer, a web-based case management and deconfliction system designed specifically for law enforcement, focuses on facilitating information sharing within and among law enforcement agencies. Case Explorer is provided free of charge to all law enforcement. Case Explorer is housed on a separate, secure system.
